


Ecology and Ornithology




Ecology and Ornithology surveys for habitats, birds and protected species to inform the Environmental Impact Assessment, will be undertaken over the coming months.

Hydrology

Hydrological walkover surveys will be undertaken to inform all aspects of the Proposed Development, feeding into the final design and siting of the Proposed Development and associated infrastructure to avoid potential impacts with the water environment on site.

The assessment will be informed by consultation with Northumberland County Council and key stakeholders.

Cultural Heritage and Archaeology



The cultural heritage assessment approach will be informed through consultation with Northumberland County Council archaeology and heritage teams as well as Historic England and site visits.

The assessment will consider both direct effects of the Proposed Development on heritage assets in addition to indirect effects, such as changes to the setting of nearby heritage assets.

Direct impacts have been avoided through the careful siting of the turbine and associated infrastructure.
